The Bible

In conversation this week a disagreement about the Bible came up. I know, a rarity amongst Baptist, there were two opinions about what the Bible meant. We all have opinions about what the Bible intends, but how we resolve those differences matters deeply. Baptists have often referred to themselves as people of the Book. I've heard the phrase 'no creed but the Bible'. Both ideas point to a very, VERY important point. Our theology is supposed to have one primary source. God is the source, revealed through Scripture, inspired by the Holy Spirit. Yet when people disagree it often degenerates into a war of opinions. So, when disagreements come up it is important to remember that we are not supposed to be a people who argue to be right, but a people who are seeking truth in God's Word. When we have disagreements and questions, instead of arguing over what we think, open it up and read it for what it says. In Second Timothy we are given some guidelines as to how we should read God's Word: "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

Here are some guidelines for reading the Bible well. Whether it is motivated by a disagreement or not, approach God's Word with humility. We come to God for salvation, but we also come daily for correction, reproof, and teaching. Know that God's Word has something to teach you, and when you hit those passages that offend you, or challenge what you know, have the wisdom and humility to consider that God might actually be right, and we might be wrong!

Approach God's Word with hope. Understand that God intends the Word to equip us for good! We can understand and learn from it, so read with the intention to be better equipped and trained to be righteous in life. God's Word is not simply devotional material to make us feel better about difficulties, it is meant to equip us to live well in every circumstance, especially the difficult ones.

And finally, when you wrestle with hard subjects, let the clear instruct the unclear. Even Peter acknowledged that some of Paul's writings were difficult to understand! There are passages that can be taken out of context and abused...Snake handling comes to mind but is by no means the only one! When you are unsure of what a passage may mean – let verses that are clear guide your understanding. This does not mean pit one verse against another seeking to create contradictions, but to resolve them. It is not whether you like what a verse says, but whether it is comprehensible. God's Word is meant for a correction to us, we should conform to it, not the Bible conforming to us.

Understand that the Word of God is given to reveal His nature, our story, His solution, and our hope in Christ. It is meant to do all that Paul wrote to Timothy, resulting in a people that are "complete, equipped for every good work". So evaluate how you approach God's Word on the basis of God's intent for it – not man's!
