Happy New Year

With the New Year on us, it is inevitable that we talk about New Year's resolutions and new starts and such. In that vein, I want you to consider Colossians 3:1-2

"If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth."

These verses do not need a new year but are certainly appropriate. Set your minds, seek the things. Good words at any time, we need to be reminded to deliberately aim high. The truth of life is that we all get tired, worn down, have times of discouragement, wrestle with illness, apathy and struggle with temptation. So, times like New Year's are appropriate as semi-scheduled reorientations of life and goals. It is easy to get fatalistic, but the conditional nature of the commands in the letter to Colossae remind us that one of the most profound testimonies of the truth of the gospel is found in changed lives.

So, first **IF** you have been raised with Christ. The nature of salvation can be debated all day long, but at the end is a very pragmatic question. What difference does it make? We command people to confess their sins, we plead with people to forsake this world and their foolish pride. But what changes in your life as a professing believer, commend Christ to the hearer? The Bible speaks very plainly that those who are God's are "born again", we are 'New Creations', we are Transformed. It is indisputable that if we are truly in Christ we are not of the world. So, the passage presents two important distinctions for us.

The first involves choosing to deliberately set your minds. Two truths here are reflective of the truth of salvation. The first is that we **can** choose what is good and Godly. In the new life we have in Christ we still wrestle with sin, but the distinction is that we do wrestle! There can and should be an optimism of the faith that sets the person and character of Christ before us constantly – reminding us that there is always an answer to temptation, and struggle. So, choose Christ, set your mind toward holiness and good.

Setting our minds leads to the final issue, what do you choose to strive towards. We above all should be striving toward the things above. In other words, aim high! As in aim beyond this world and the influence of the fall and sin. We were made in God's image, let's not be content in anything less that Godliness of character and thought! We will and do fail, that's not really the issue though. The issue is whether Christ and salvation is powerful enough to lead us ever upward and onward. We may not achieve perfection on earth, but we ought to be aiming and striving for it every day of our lives!

So, make your resolutions, don't let the world overcome the Holy Spirit in your life's aims and intents. Always strive and set you mind on things above, so others will truly see the power of Christ in and through our lives.

My response is that the association is a Mission Resource that is always there for the local Church; to assist, empower, encourage and promote the diverse programs and projects of the congregations that make up the association. The association Assists, (key word) and must assist, each congregation in fulfilling its individual calling to Kingdom work, fulfilling the Great Commission. Loyd Corder, Director of the Associational Services Division of the Home Mission Board, defined an association as "A fellowship of churches on mission in their setting." purpose of the association has become well defined: to do what could not be done singly, increase the

body in weight, increase in strength and achieve greater purpose."

Our **Purpose**: to <u>ASSIST</u> the member churches in (reaching, teaching) touching every person with the gospel of Jesus Christ; by <u>Stimulating</u> greater fellowship, spiritual growth and unity among the churches; <u>Strengthening</u> ministries of stewardship, evangelism, missions and discipleship within the churches; and <u>Providing Opportunities to engage Cooperatively in Missions and Ministries</u> which the churches cannot adequately support individually. We do not have a Director of Missions to lead Mission and Ministry efforts, so we use of "The Spirit" not only to <u>Inform</u> member Churches of what is going on in the association; i.e., "Church News", but to also <u>Encourage</u> member Churches to participate with other churches by "providing Opportunities to engage Cooperatively in Missions and Ministries which the churches cannot adequately support individually." Remember our Purpose, both Churches and Association, is to reach Bedford County for Christ. No One Church Can Do This ALONE!

Our Vision: Due to our common faith in Jesus Christ and His Body, the Church, we Commit ourselves to Connecting with one another, for Coordinating the missions and ministries of our member churches, and Communicating opportunities to partner together to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandment. Notice those 4 C's; we make a Commitment to Connect, Coordinate, and Communicate between Churches. That's where our monthly Associational Newsletter, "The Spirit," comes in; to help Connect member Churches to Coordinate and Communicate Mission and Ministry endeavors between member Churches. "Kingdom Work is Greater than any Single Church." (see previous Values) It is imperative that we share with each other the Mission Opportunities and Ministries that each Church is doing; to "Partner Together to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandment."

Our **Values:** The **Bible** is God's Holy Word inspired by the Holy Spirit. It is our guide, final authority, source of unity and motivation for service to the honor and glory of God. **Salvation** is the gift of God's Grace through Faith. It is accomplished once and for all by the substitutionary death of Jesus Christ on the Cross and His Resurrection from the dead. We are commanded by God in the **Great Commission** to take the Gospel to our neighborhoods, cities, nation and the world. The visible result of our **Obedience** to the Great Commission is the growth of our local autonomous Baptist Churches, distinguished by believers' baptism by immersion and a commitment to the Word of God. But the Value that unites us and inspires us - **Kingdom Work is Greater than any Single Church**. Therefore we recognize the need to **Cooperate** and **Fellowship** with like-minded Baptist Churches in pursuit of a unified witness to our local communities. **Strawberry - Reaching the world for Christ begins right here in Bedford County.**
