

"Significance of the Stone at His Resurrection"

Most people greet you this time of year with the traditional greeting, "Happy Easter." I prefer the European Greeting, "Happy Resurrection Day," because it reminds me of the real reason we Celebrate Easter. We know the Gospel story - Jesus Died on the Cross to Save us from our Sins, and they Buried Him in a borrowed Grave. Jesus' Death on the Cross Saves us from Hell, the penalty of Sin, but story doesn't end there. Jesus Arose from the Grave to give us Eternal Life. The Disciples believed Jesus was Dead, as did the women who followed them, but on the 3rd Day after His Crucifixion, the women came to the Tomb early, looking for Jesus. They came to

anoint His Body for proper burial, but the Tomb had been Sealed by Pilate. Their biggest concern was, "Who will Roll Away the Stone?" They needed to get into the Tomb to see Jesus, so the Angel rolled the Stone away for them. But What is the Significance of the Stone that the Angel Rolled Away from the Grave?

The Stone Reminds us of the Despair of Death. The Stone blocked the way, so those on the outside could not get in, and the inside would not get out, or so the Romans and Jews thought. A lot of people believe Death is the End, this life is all there is to Life. Some People Believe we shall never see our loved ones again, they are dead and gone. But the Stone was Rolled Away to let us in, not to let Jesus out. They needed to see there is more to Life than Death. Death is not the end, it's only the beginning. There is Life after Death. The question is, "Where will you spend Life after Death?" Jesus Arose from the Grave to Conquer Death. He's Alive!

The Stone Reminds us the Efforts of the Enemy. The Tomb was Sealed by the Roman Rulers to maintain the status quo, to keep things quiet and orderly. The Religious Leaders wanted to silence Jesus, because He reminded them of their Sins. Satan wanted to Kill Jesus, so he Shut Him in the Tomb, because he wanted to Destroy the Son of God. But the Grave could not Hold Him, He was not there, He was already gone. Jesus came to Die on the Cross, then Arise from the Grave, He wasn't going to stay dead. *He Arose from the Grave to Conquer Sin and Satan.* A Stone could not Hold Him in the Grave.

The Stone Reminds us of Anything that Separates us from the Savior. The Stone separated the women from Jesus; it kept them from Doing what they came to do, to anoint His body for a proper Jewish burial. Unbelief separates us from Jesus; they believed they were Helpless before the Stone. It would take two strong men to roll it out of the way. Sin separates us from Jesus, they were separated from their Master. Inactivity also separates us, they didn't believe they were able to roll away the stone, so they were going to let somebody else do it. Jesus Arose to Prove He is God, Nothing can separate us from God. He Rolled the Stone Away!

It was our **Sins** that nailed Jesus to the Cross, His **Enemies** tried to keep Him in the Tomb, the **Stone** Separated us from Him, so **He Rolled the Stone Away**, so we could get in, to show us He is Alive. The angel told the women, "He is <u>Not Here</u>, for He is Risen, <u>Come</u>, <u>See</u> the place where the Lord lay. Then <u>Go</u> quickly <u>and Tell</u> His Disciples that He has risen from the Dead." The Stone has been Rolled Away! Do Not Despair of Death, an Empty Grave reminds us Death is not the end of Life. Do Not allow Satan to Defeat you, an Empty Grave reminds us Jesus Won the Battle by His Resurrection. Do Not allow Anything to separate us from the Savior, whether Unbelief, Sin, or Inactivity. "Nothing can separate us from the Love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord!" (Rom 8:38-39) Not even a Stone.
