Prayer Summit

Over the past few months at Flint Hill Baptist Church, we have been studying the Book of Acts on Sunday mornings. While studying Acts and the Church in its earliest days, there has been a theme that has really stuck out as being of vital importance: **Prayer!**

After Jesus had ascended in Acts 1, we see the Apostles and others going back to the Upper Room and "continually devoting themselves to prayer" (Acts 1:14, NASB).

Before they cast lots to see who would replace Judas Iscariot, the group **prayed**. (Acts 1:24)

After Pentecost and the church bringing in the first group of new believers, we see the early church devoting themselves to teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, and **prayer**. (Acts 2:42)

After Peter and John had been arrested and threatened repeatedly by the Council not to preach in Jesus' Name anymore, they went back to fellow believers, told them what had happened, and they all **prayed** together for boldness. (Acts 4:24-31)

And these are just a few of the examples that you will find in the first few chapters of the Book of Acts, let alone throughout the rest of Scripture. The point being, the early church put a huge priority on **prayer**. And when we look around our churches today, and in the church as a whole in America, in most cases our prayer lives are lacking at best. When we look around the churches in our association, the churches in our state, and in our nation, it is not hard to see a decline in attendance, commitment, and passion in recent years. We can blame that on a number of things, but the question at this time in history is: What is the response of the Church today going to be? We can play the blame game, but that isn't going to further the Great Commission. Looking at Acts, I'm convinced that nothing in our churches, association, or nation is going to change unless **Prayer** is at the center of it.

If we want to grow closer in our relationship with God, if we want to see change in our lives, if we want to see change in our churches and in our nation, then it must start with **prayer**.

Prayer is something that we have taken lightly for far too long. We need to emphasize **prayer** and get our churches **praying** together. That is where I hope you and your church will join us. Over the next couple of months, we would like to get a list of churches together that would be willing to host a **Prayer Summit** on a Wednesday each month. There would be a different emphasis to our prayers each month (examples: one month we will pray for our churches, one month we will pray for our families, missions/missionaries, the persecuted church, our military, our nation, our communities/neighbors, etc...) and the church that is hosting would have their pastor share verses or say a few words related to the topic of **prayer** for the evening. You can make handouts to emphasize certain things to pray for or to give people ideas of things to pray for in regard to each emphasis. Each church is encouraged to invite and come with their people to the **Prayer Summit** each month as a chance to fellowship with other believers and most importantly to come together in prayer with each other.

Depending on the number of topics of emphasis and the number of churches willing to host, this **Prayer Summit** may go for a few months or a year. But **Prayer** must be at the center of it. If your church would be willing to host one of these monthly **Prayer Summits** or if you have an idea for a topic of emphasis for one of these evenings, let me know so that we can make a calendar of host churches and assign topics to each church.
