"Back to School"

It's September, summer is over, the weather is starting to change, and the kids are **Back to School**. Those 3 words - **Back to School** – brings images and memories to all of us, whether we are parents getting ready for school, grandparents taking care of children before or after school, or even children going to school. We also know it costs money to send our children to school, whether elementary, high school or even college. We've all been to Wal-Mart to buy paper and pencils, markers, notebooks, calculators, and other essential items necessary for school work. A lot of us have helped pack a bus, or donated items to a particular school or group collecting money and supplies for those less fortunate that maybe cannot afford to buy school supplies. That's where we come in.

I'm talking **Adopt-a-School**. I'm asking, encouraging, each Church in Strawberry Association to intentionally reach out to make a connection, or relationship, with a school in your area. All our churches have students, teachers, or even administrative personnel, like principals and guidance counselors that attend our churches on a regular basis. So, I'm again asking, encouraging, each Church to not just adopt a student, but **Adopt the Whole School**. It may be something as simple as taking a box of school supplies to the School Office. Pastors, walk into the Principal's Office, stick out your hand, introduce yourself, and ask, "How can we Help you?" (You may want to make an appointment first.) You may be surprised by the look on his face; there are always needs for every school that the School Board and/or parents cannot take care of. The school may need more supplies that they use a lot of, like paper, pencils, markers, and notebooks, or sometimes special items like flash drives for the teachers. For several years our Church bought a pack of flash drives for a local school for the teachers to use.

Another idea for **Adopt-a-School** is to *Adopt the Whole School*. One Church did this, they adopted the Whole School. Every month they did something for the School, providing meals for the teachers, recognizing the support staff, the custodians, cleaning and maintenance personnel, and doing things for the office personnel. They recognized Teachers and Staff birthdays; awarding certificates for Employee of the Month, and served meals for Teacher Appreciation Week. Our Church provided Ice Cream because another Church provided Chick-Fil-A sandwiches for the Teachers for Lunch one day.

If your Church has a Youth Pastor, have him throw a tailgate party for your Youth group before the football games, an invite everybody, "Ya'll Come!" They may need to get permission first, but sometimes the school will allow the Youth Pastor to speak to the student body. What an excellent opportunity to witness for Jesus. Ask your Church members if they would be willing to serve as substitute teachers, to put a Christian witness in all our schools. There are many ways to witness and share the Love of Jesus.

What I'm talking about is **Missions** and **Ministry**. If your Church has students or Teachers in a local school, what an opportunity to *Minister* to them as they teach and help their students, and a lot of times, are under-appreciated. As for the students, they get to see Jesus outside of the Church walls, as your Church *Ministers* to them, encouraging and helping them along the way. But this is also *Missions*, you're helping someone that needs Help, and cannot help themselves, and not expecting anything in return. Your Church may not have any students, teachers or administrators in the school, and you may never get any new members from the school, but *GO* and *Give* something, anything, and do it in Jesus' name, whether a pencil and paper, or a meal, a cup of water, or even a Thank-You. (*Missions is not getting your nickel back*) You do this because Jesus said *Do it*. (*He said something about "Go," and "Love your neighbor.")*

Our Schools, both public and private, are **Mission Fields**, crying out for us to *Come and Help* them. Would you consider going **Back to School**, as a Mission project this year? **For the Whole Year!**


